

Hurricane Preparedness

Prepare Before Hurricane Season

- Develop an evacuation plan
- Assemble disaster supplies: food, water, batteries, charger, radio, cash
- Get an insurance checkup and document your possessions
- Create a communication plan with a hand-written list of contacts
- Strengthen your home

When preparing for a hurricane, having a well-stocked kit can make a huge difference in ensuring you and your loved ones stay safe during an emergency. From food and water to first aid supplies and important documents, building a kit with all your essentials can help you feel more prepared and in control in the face of potential danger.

SUPPLIES TO INCLUDE IN YOUR KIT

- Water
- Food (non-perishable food)
- Radio
- Flashlight
- First aid kit
- Extra batteries
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Dust mask
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place)
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)
- Manual can opener (for food)
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery

EVACUATION PLAN

In the event of an evacuation, have a plan in place and begin preparing and identifying secure locations and mapping evacuation routes near the CLS community. Additionally, remember to consider the type of emergency shelter your pets may require during an evacuation.



EVACUATION TIPS TO CONSIDER

- Prepare a "go-bag" that you can easily carry if you must evacuate on foot or on public transportation.
- Download the [FEMA app](#) for a list of open shelters during an active disaster in your local area.
- Reach out and make a plan with neighbors, friends, or relatives to make sure that someone is available to care for or evacuate your pets if you are unable to do so.
